## Making Best Use of this Diary

At the beginning of the academic year, please fill in your child's complete particulars.

1. Do ensure that any changes are immediately informed to the school such as change in address, telephone numbers etc in writing. Ignorance will not be taken as an excuse.
2. Please check the School Diary whenever your child returns from school and countersign all new entries or remarks. If for any reason your child is unable to complete an assignment, please enter the reason and sign the entry.
3. Parents should review current pages daily and must countersign and respond to any comments, which may be made periodically by members of the faculty.
4. Comments made by parents in this diary should be productive and confined strictly to the subject of the student's work and her/his conduct. All other matters concerning the School should be dealt with separately and either conveyed personally or through separate letters/e-mails addressed to the Head of School.

Students should ensure that they bring this School Diary to school every day, use it productively and treat it with care.

## Evaluation System and Assessments w.e.f. Session 2018-19

### CLASS - Pre School to IV:

1. The academic year is divided into FIVE cycles. There are no formal examinations for these classes. However, evaluation of the child's progress is done on the basis of day to day performance under the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation .
2. No Formal Tests will be held for classes Pre-School - IV
3. Theme-based assessments are carried out in various ways which include written assessments via worksheets and written work done in the notebooks in school and at home, oral assessments via classroom discussions and interactions, and activity assessments that are judged primarily through evaluation Rubrics .
4. Activities, project activities, Learning Centre activities, creative work, etc. are graded and Progress Reports are given to parents thrice in a session during the Open House at the end of two cycles.

### CLASS V to X: Uniform System of Evaluation assessment.

1. **Class X Board Examination .**
2. In addition to academic performance, grades will be awarded for both scholastic and co-scholastic areas.
3. Academic performance is recorded in the Report Card, based on the eight point grade scale specified by C.B.S.E.
4. Final Evaluation will be based on Annual Examination (80 marks) & Internal Assessment (20 marks):
  - a) **Annual Examination: 80 Marks** (reduced to 60 marks)  
Complete syllabus at the end of the year where :  
Class V-VI : 10% of First Term Syllabus & Entire syllabus of II Term  
Class VII : 20% of First Term Syllabus & Entire syllabus of II Term  
Class VIII : 30% of First Term Syllabus & Entire syllabus of II Term
  - b) **Half Yearly Examination: 80 Marks** (reduced to 20 marks)  
(Syllabus covered till announcement of schedule for Half Yearly Examination)
  - c) **Internal Assessment (Term I & Term II) : 10 marks per term**
    - (i) Periodic Tests - 50 Marks each (reduced to 5 marks)  
(Syllabus covered till announcement of schedule for Periodic Tests)
    - (ii) Notebook Maintenance - 5 Marks (reduced to 2.5 marks)  
Before each periodic test, notebook maintenance can be evaluated based on the following parameters –  
a) Regularity b) Assignment completion c) Neatness
    - (iii) Subject Enrichment Activities – 5 Marks (reduced to 2.5 marks)  
Subject Enrichment Activities comprises of ASL/ Reading/ Dictation/ Debate/Public Speaking etc. for language, Lab Activities/ Projects/ Map Work/ Model Making / Field trips etc. for other subjects

- **Scholastic Areas:** Language, Language 1, Language 2, Language 3, Mathematics, Science Social, Science, any other Subject.  
These are graded on a eight point scale (A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, C2, D & E) 'E' Grade- Needs Improvement (Classes V-VIII) & Failed (Class IX & X)
- **Co-Scholastic Areas:** Life skills, Work Ed., Visual & Performing Arts, Attitudes & Values, Literary & Creative skills, ICT, Health & Physical Ed. graded on a three point scale (A-Outstanding, B-Very Good, C-Fair)
- All students will be assessed on discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behavior, values, tidiness, attitude towards society & Nation, respectfulness for rules & regulations.  
Class VIII will be graded on 3 Point scale & Class IX on 5 point Scale.

**CLASS XI & XII :** assessed as per CBSE guidelines for AISSCE .

Students of Class XII must obtain 45% marks in the Pre-Board Assessment & 75% attendance in order to obtain the admission card.

- Students using unfair means during any test or assessment will be disqualified. Such students can also be rusticated from the school.
- Submission of Class-work / Home-work / Projects / Assignments is mandatory as they are part of the regular assessment.
- In order to achieve specified standards, regular attendance, timely submission of assignments and sustained efforts are most important.
- Date sheet/syllabus for tests/assessments is handed over about 15 days before their commencement.

### Promotion Criteria:

**Classes Pre-School to VIII:** No child will be detained. Results will be prepared on the basis of rules framed by CBSE. However, attendance less than 90% and inability to cope with the syllabus resulting in low grades in assessments of a particular class in a session may result in detention in the same class, after mutual consent of parents and school authorities.

**Classes IX & X:** As per CBSE Guidelines.

**Class XI:** Will be based on consolidated performance of all assessments conducted by the school during the year.

- **10% weightage of 2 unit tests of 50 marks each**
- **40% weightage of mid- term assessment i.e. 50% of 80 marks.**
- **50% weightage of annual examination i.e. 50% of 100 marks.**  
However, for promotion, it is mandatory for the student to appear and secure 40% marks in all theory and practical subjects separately along with 90% attendance.

**Criteria for XII:** As per CBSE Guidelines.

### Parent-Teacher Meetings

- Parent-Teacher meetings are held at regular intervals. They are an opportunity to exchange views about your child's progress with the teacher. It is mandatory for parents to attend Parent Teacher meetings.
- You will be informed of the date for the Parent Teacher Meetings, in advance, through the website or the Student/Parent Portal.
- Please make an effort to attend all Parent Teacher meetings as this is an important way of remaining updated about your child's progress.

### Appointments with the Principal or the Class Teacher

- Parents can help us by not disturbing classes during school hours or meeting any teacher without prior appointment.
- Timing for meeting teachers is from 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. in summer and 2:55 to 3:30 p.m. in winter on Monday, Wednesday and Friday when the school is in session. (Pre-Primary Wing: Uditayan on working Saturdays i.e. First and third Saturday with prior appointment) You can seek an appointment for the above days by making a note on the Appointments Page of this Diary, at least one working day in advance, and asking your child to have it confirmed by the Class Teacher.
- In order to meet the Principal you may obtain an appointment, from the School reception, on a written request.
- Whenever an appointment is accepted for meeting the Principal or a teacher, a 'Visitor's Slip' will be filled and signed, by the concerned teacher, on the Appointments Page of this Diary. Please detach this slip and carry it along with the duplicate ID card when you come for the appointment.

### Attendance, Absence and Leave

- Your child's safety is important. You are advised not take your child away, during school hours except in case of an emergency, and only with permission from the school authorities.
- Promotion is granted on the basis of the whole year's work. **C.B.S.E rules require a minimum attendance of 75%** for this purpose.
- Students are not granted leave outside the regular vacation period except in cases of illness.
- Your child should be punctual to school. In case of absence on the previous day you must send a letter of justification for the same and have it countersigned by the class teacher.
- Every absence must be entered in the 'Leave Record' page of the diary and signed by the Parent/Guardian.
- Absence on medical grounds will be recorded by the Class Teacher only on receipt of a valid Medical Certificate.

- If your child is **absent for more than one week**, without prior permission, it is considered an act of indiscipline and his/her name will be struck off the school rolls. Re-admission, if granted, will be upon payment of re-admission fees. Re-admission is allowed, only twice. No re-admissions will be allowed less than one month before the commencement of the Annual Assessment.
- Students who do not submit written assessments on valid grounds, will have to take a re-test and will not be eligible for school badges or any other awards.
- No leave of absence is granted except on medical grounds. Any absence during examination and Sick leave for more than 2 days must be supported by a medical certificate. However, if your child returns to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, he/she must produce a fitness certificate from a doctor that clears him/her to attend school.

Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class :-

## **ID Card**

- In view of heightened security concerns, your child will be issued ID Cards. He / she must bring the ID Card to school every day as it is part of the school uniform. You must also carry the Parent ID Card while coming to school or picking up your child.

## **Late Arrival in School**

- Students are expected to reach school 10 minutes before the start of the assembly. Students arriving late will not be allowed to enter the school premises without a plausible explanation.
- Arriving late for school is not acceptable.
- Students found to have come late for more than three days in a term/semester will not be allowed to attend classes on fourth such occurrence and disciplinary action shall be taken against them.
- On each occurrence of reporting late to school, the 'Record of Late Coming' section will be stamped and initialed by the Teacher on Duty at Gate Number-01, specifying the date and time of late arrival.

## **Payment of Fees**

- All fees must be paid by cheque or bank draft payable at New Delhi as per instructions in the bill. Please ensure that the following details are written on the reverse:
  - Name
  - Class & Section
  - Admission Number
- Fees can be deposited, with the Accountant, in the School Accounts Office (Senior School Building) from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on all working days. Note: The school office functions even during vacations throughout the year on all working days.
- Parents are expected to pay school dues on time.
- A child admitted after start of term, fees will be charged for the entire academic session.

## **Withdrawal Policy**

- If a student wishes to withdraw admission from the school:
  - In the Session:** is not permitted, however if unavoidable and after the approval from the principal, one clear calendar month fees i.e. fees including transport if applicable from the 1st day of the month following the application for withdrawal will be charged.
  - End of Session:** If you wish to withdraw before the commencement of the new session you must apply before 28th February 2022 else you will have to pay the fees for the month of April 2022 and all other dues of the school.
- At the time of withdrawal, students are required to surrender their identity card/Bus Pass along with a no dues certificate. Transfer certificate will not be issued until all dues are settled.

## **Issue of Transfer Certificate and other documents**

- In case parents apply for Transfer Certificate (TC) for their ward, the fees (as applicable) will have to be paid for that particular month (in which the hardcopy of the application is received by the school office).
- **Security Deposit** submitted at the time of admission will only be released if all dues are cleared and TC has been issued. Security Deposit money will be paid within 45 days of the date of issue of TC.
- Issue of Certificates and other documents including Recommendation Letters, Bonafide Certificates, Fee Payment Certificate and other documents required by parent, will be issued on a written request, free of cost.
- Duplicate Transfer Certificate will only be issued after an affidavit stating the loss of the said document and copy of FIR is submitted at School Office, along with a fee of Rs.500. Duplicate / Subsequent copies of Bonafide Certificate and Fee Payment Certificate will be issued on payment of Rs.100 for each such additional copy during an academic session.

Socks	Lemon yellow with two beige stripes
Shoes	Black shoes with laces.

#### Winter Uniform:

Shirts	Woven sky blue colour with pink/yellow vertical pin stripes, full sleeves with a collar and the monogram on the left side pocket.
Trouser	Worsted beige with sky blue trimmings.
Socks	Light blue woollen socks with beige stripes
Pullover	Thick cable knit electric blue, having beige stripes & a 'V' neck.
Blazer	Single breasted three button woollen Electric blue with embroidered crest on the top left pocket.

### GIRLS

#### Summer Uniform:

Shirts	Lemon yellow colour woven & printed with pin stripes, half sleeves with a beige trim collar & the monogram on the left side pocket.
Skirts -	Terri-cotton beige box pleated with yellow trims, 2 inches above the knees. Skirts are compulsory for all from I to VII std.
Socks -	Lemon yellow with blue stripes
Shoes -	Black shoes with laces.
Salwar -	Lemon yellow woven & printed with pin stripes, half sleeves Kameez with a beige trim collar & the monogram on the left side

pocket. Terri-cotton beige fabric tapering salwar, Girls of std. VII to XII have to wear salwar kameez.

#### Winter Uniform:

Shirts	Same as Boys winter uniform
Skirts	Worsted beige tunics, 2 inches above the knees.
Socks	Light blue woollen socks with beige stripes.
Pullover	Same as Boys
Blazer	Same as boys
Salwar -	Sky blue colour woven & printed with yellow/ pink pin stripes,
Kameez	full sleeves kameez with a beige trim collar & the monogram on the left side pocket. Terri-cotton beige fabric tapering salwar.

#### Note :

- Light Blue turbans will be the head wear for sikh boys.
- Friday: All will be dressed in the white uniform with similar specification and white PT shoes .
- School Tie/Scarf is compulsory for special functions and with winter uniform.
- Fine of Rs. 100/- will be imposed if students do not come in proper uniform to school.
- Names should be tagged on blazers & sweaters.

## Bookshop

## Helping Your Child do Better at School

- You are requested to read and explain relevant contents of this diary to your child.
- Please ensure that your child devotes sufficient time to completing assignments and daily revision of lessons at home.
- Please help us in maintaining a supportive, caring and disciplined environment in school. In extreme cases, the school may be forced to impose penalties, in-school or out-of-school, suspension and even expel students whose conduct is harmful to other students; However, this is only a last resort, keeping the parent fully informed, and after all other measures have failed to improve the child's behaviour.
- By co-operating with us in following these guidelines you can play an important part in your child's progress.
- If you have any suggestions, please convey them in a letter or e-mail addressed to the Principal. This diary is only for your child's school activities, assignments and conduct.

- Communications by parents or guardians should be addressed to the Principal or to the Class Teacher.
- We recommend that you consult the MBIIS Parent-Student Portal, Website ([www.mbiis.in](http://www.mbiis.in)) for information, Date Sheets and other circulars before making enquiries on the phone.
- The school communicates information through MBIIS Parent-Student Portal and SMS messages. Digital empowerment allows you to download latest happenings, homework, notices and updates “anytime”, “anywhere”! thus reducing paperwork and in turn helping us do our bit to stop climate change. You must ensure that your current details and mobile number is always updated with the school authorities.

## Safety of Belongings

- All your child's belongings must bear his/her name and class. This will make it easier to locate lost property. However, the school cannot take responsibility for any losses.
- Please do not give excessive pocket money to your child.
- Presenting gifts or reward to teachers/staff is strictly prohibited.
- Please do not allow your child to bring valuable articles like expensive watches, fountain pens, laptops, calculators or jewellery to school. In case of any loss, the school makes every effort to trace the item but we cannot undertake any responsibility for the loss.

## Traveling Between Home and School

- You are requested to personally see off and receive your child at the bus stop, please carry the ID card of the child.  
**Note:** If children from Nursery to Class IV are not received at the bus stop on time, they will be brought back to school and parents will have to pick them up from the school.
- Please note that the school does not undertake any responsibility whatsoever for any damage or injury that might be caused as a result of any accident by bus or any other conveyance provided by the school. The school will however, take reasonable precautions against any such mishaps.
- You are advised to not allow underage students to drive cars and two wheelers as this is not only dangerous but also a punishable offence.
- The Government has banned all vans that are not approved for use by school children. We therefore advise you to avoid risking the safety of your child by using such illegal transport. However we welcome car-pooling.
- If the school bus-pass is lost, a duplicate pass must be obtained from the school after depositing a fee of Rs. 100.00
- Students should not travel on the school buses without a valid pass.
- Please ensure that children proceeding on excursions, visits, tours, picnics etc. are dropped and picked up, from the school, only by you.

## Mobile Phones and Electronic Gadgets

- Mobile phones, Music players and Tablets are **strictly prohibited** in the school and are liable to be **permanently confiscated** by the school authorities.

### Open Days

- Talk to a teacher if someone makes you feel scared or uncomfortable.
- If something dangerous or unsafe is going on, in or around the school, tell a teacher immediately.

- Obey and play by the rules.
- Cooperate with umpires, referees and instructors.
- Be well behaved at all sporting venues.
- Wear the team or school uniform.

### Playing

- Play with your own age group. Play safely (e.g. no rough games).
- Play active games only in places that are safe and where there will be no damage to any property.
- Care for the safety of others and do not throw sticks or stones.
- Play ball games only on the playing fields/courts.

## **Excursions**

- Participate in all excursions.
- Be on your best behaviour.
- Follow the dress code.
- Cooperate with teachers and parents.
- Cooperate with each other.
- Look after your own property.

## **Breaking the Rules**

If you break any of the rules, the teacher will remind you of the rules and:

- Give a warning, or
- Send you for time out, or
- Send you to sit in the corridor or outside the office, or
- Give detention during recess/breaks, or
- Speak to your class Teacher, Coordinator, Principal or your parents, or
- Give in-school or out-of-school detention (Parents will be given 24 hours' notice).

## **Dropping Litter**

- Use the litter bins.
- You will be asked to pick up the litter that you drop in the school .
- After picking up any litter please wash your hands.

## **Accidents in the School**

- If there is an accident in the school, immediately ask the teacher on duty for help.

## **In Conclusion Please Note**

- When you feel good about yourself it is easier to succeed.
- Be active and participate in all co-curriculars during and after school hours.
- By highlighting the good points of others, we feel happier and also treat each other well.
- You must understand that when rules are followed, you do not have to worry about consequences.
- If you are not sure about something, it is always better to check with a teacher or a parent.
