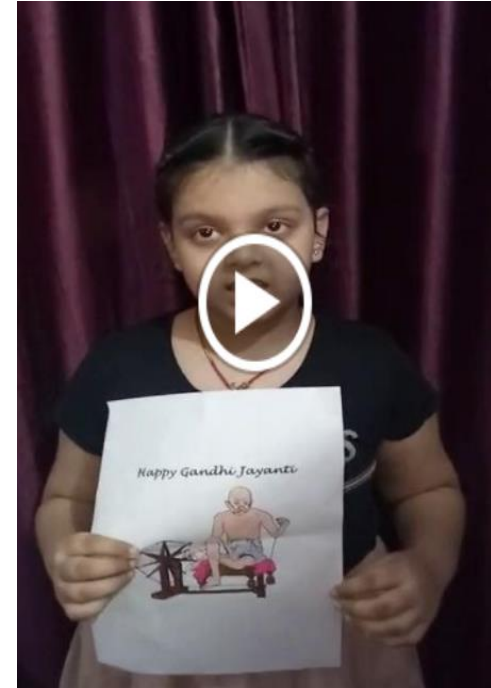


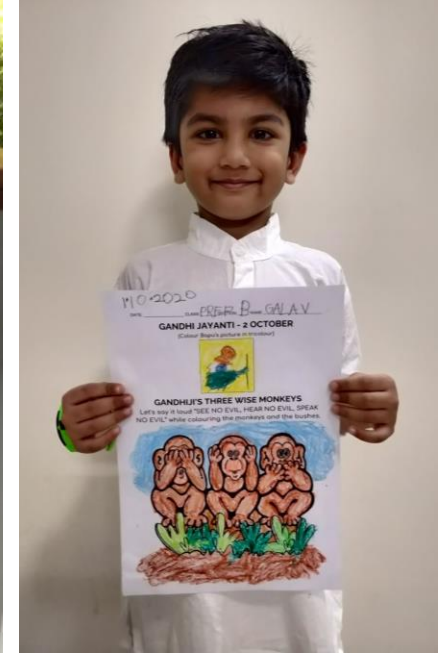


Gandhi Jayanti Celebration
